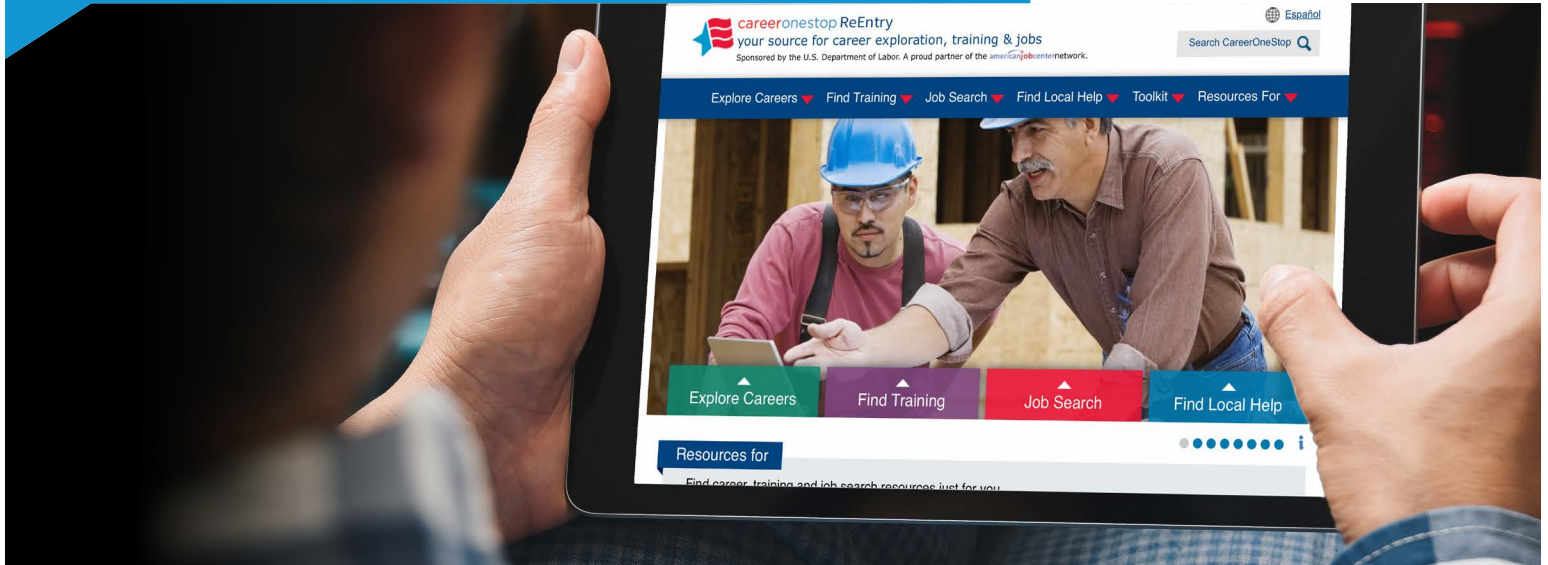


# CareerOneStop ReEntry

Now people in facilities without Internet connection can access CareerOneStop's full range of tools and resources on CareerOneStop ReEntry ([ReEntry.CareerOneStop.org](https://ReEntry.CareerOneStop.org)), including:

- Tips and information for incarcerated individuals
- Job search preparation

**CareerOneStop ReEntry** is a version of CareerOneStop developed specifically for use in correctional facilities. Inmates, instructors, and other intermediaries can access the full range of tools, resources, and information—without the risk of active Internet links. The site features:

- No active links to external websites
- No social media sharing or other external functionality

## Resources for individuals with criminal records

People preparing for reentry and those who have already transitioned from incarceration can benefit from the Job Search Help for Ex-Offenders portal. The portal provides resources to help individuals with criminal records navigate their post-incarceration career, training, and employment paths. Tools and resources are available to help **Explore Careers, Get Training, and Find a Job**.

Job Search Help for Ex-Offenders is offered within **CareerOneStop ReEntry**, as well as on the full CareerOneStop website ([CareerOneStop.org/ExOffender](https://CareerOneStop.org/ExOffender)). The portal also offers two printable resources:

- The **Job Search Guide for People with a Criminal Record** is a 43-page PDF document that includes all Job Search Help for Ex-Offenders content
- **Ex-Offender Local Resources** is a 132-page PDF document with names, locations, contact information, and descriptions of hundreds of local organizations in all 50 states that provide targeted employment and job search assistance to people with criminal records
